Please find enclosed herewith the revisedResettlement Plan (RP) of Pali Water Supply and sewerage project under Phase III (ADB loan no. 3183-IND) as per ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement 2009 for approval and further necessary action.

Being a Design Build and Operate (DBO) contract, during the finalization of Service Improvement Plan (SIP), on the basis of technical requirements and public consultations, location of 2 Sewer Pumping Station (SwPS) and lands of Consumer Relation Management Centre (CRMC- 4), and centre control centre (CCC-1) buildings were identified. In addition to that cleaning and renovation of Lakhotia Talab/ Pond has also been taken up in this sub-project. Accordingly this resettlement plan (RP) is revised after Service Improvement Plan (SIP), to indicate the final components of the project.

A Due diligence has been conducted by PMDSC expert and it has been confirmed that no land acquisition is involved, few location of proposed works has been changed but the construction is confined in the government land.

Length of the water and sewer network of the town has also changed during finalization of SIP but since the Social Impact Assessment (SIA) and census and socio economic survey (100%) of the entire town was already conducted, there is no change in categorization of RP. As per due diligence, Cut-off date remains 24.02.2016 as no additional displaced person (DP) are identified.

The budget of the RP has been revised and reduced as RP implementation officers have been appointed for each town for implementation of RP (through a variation in PMDSC contract) and accordingly NGO costs for implementation activities has been removed from budget. The revised resettlement cost for the subproject is INR 4510495/-.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1. Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP), building on the previous two Asian Development Bank (ADB) funded projects: RUIDP and RUSDIP (also referred as RUIDP I and II respectively), will support the Government of India (GoI) and the Government of Rajasthan (GoR) in their policy of balanced regional socio-economic development and poverty reduction through improvements in urban governance, management, and infrastructure and service provision in six selected cities in Rajasthan. The selected cities¹ are particularly district headquarters with more than 100,000 population and the ones which were not benefitted under the previous two ADB funded urban sector projects. Pali Town water supply and sewerage scheme is one of the subprojects proposed under the investment component of RUSDP.
- 2. This subproject for Pali town is under implementation after approval of the resettlement plan (RP) by ADB. During the finalization of the Service Improvement Plan (SIP)², on the basis of the technical requirements and public consultations, the location of two Sewer Pumping Station (SwPS) and land for four Consumer Relation Management Centres (CRMC), and Central Control Centre (CCC) buildings was identified. In addition to that cleaning and renovation of Lakhotia Talab (Pond) has also been taken up in this sub-project. The length of water supply and sewer networks was frozen after a detailed measurement survey (DMS) by the Design-Build Operate (DBO) Contractor. The RP has been updated to include these changes. It is further confirmed that all other components remain unchanged. The new locations are provided in table 1 while details of the revised /final length of water supply and sewer network are given in table 2:-

3. The length of the water supply and sewer pipeline in the previous bill of quantity (BoQ) and a detailed project report (DPR) was tentative. During SIP, the Contractor conducted a DMS, and a length of 697.9 km has been finalized for a water supply network component and 329 km for the sewer network component. The capacity of the sewerage treatment plant (STP) was also finalized 15 mld instead of 12 mld. Some areas of the municipal boundary³ which were left in preliminary design, and BoQ has been included in the subproject scope to provide the basic utilities to maximum households. The new areas added in the sewerage work (57 km) are in the residential areas, while under the water supply component, two new residential areas (Sindhiyon ki Dhani and Chimanpur village) have been included. Besides, in some areas, the water supply pipeline will now be laid on both sides; instead of only one side as intended earlier, this will help in extending benefits to the maximum household. The comparative of the previous and final length is presented in table 2:-.

- 4. After SIP, final components of the sub-projects: **Water Supply:** (i) Distribution network improvement 697.9 km (HDPE-678.48 km and DI Pipe K7 (19.42 km); (ii) CRMC-4 nos at Gandhi Nagar, Labour colony, Naya Goan and Mandali Head Works and a CCC at PHED main campus; (iii) Provision of house service connection -57115; (iv) Provision of the domestic water meter; and (v) Cleaning and renovation works of Lakhotia Talab. **Sewerage:** (i) Sewerage Treatment Plant 15 mld in the existing STP campus; (ii) construction of two sewerage pumping stations (SwPS) one behind housing board colony and another one is near Sarvodaya Nagar with a capacity of one mld each; (iii) laying new sewers 329 km; (iv) construction of manholes-16729; (v) Pre-cast RCC inspection chamber 44691; and (vi) provision of sewer connections to houses. The project scope also includes operation and maintenance (O&M) of the created assets for ten years.
- 5. This RP is revised based on the final design and alignment provided by the DBO contractor after completion of DMS. RP is in line with the Resettlement Framework (RF) prepared for the implementation of social safeguards under RUSDP.
- 6. **Summary of Resettlement Impact:** No land acquisition is proposed in this subproject. The construction of a new sewage treatment plant (STP) will be undertaken in the existing STP campus, which is under Pali Nagar Parishad's (Municipal Body) possession. Proposed SwPS at Sarvodaya Nagar is also under Nagar Parishad's (Municipal Body) possession, and SwPS behind the housing board colony is vacant government land, which is under the possession of the Public Health Engineering Department (PHED). CRMC and CCC buildings will be constructed within the existing PHED Campus. No new land acquisition is required. No

IR impact will be anticipated during the restoration work of Lakhotia Talab. All the works like cleaning, strengthening of sidewalls, pitching will be done within the existing campus under the possession of Nagar Parishad(Municipal Body).

- 7. The new areas included in the subproject scope under the sewerage and water supply components are mostly in the residential areas and does not cause any resettlement impacts. The streets where the laying of water supply pipeline will be now undertaken on both sides of the road, the affected persons (AP) have already been accounted for. At the time of preparation of RP, people carrying on business activities on both sides of the road in the entire town were considered as the potential APs, as such, the additional components will not change in the number of people likely to be impacted. It was further reconfirmed during the due diligence, and as such cut-off date remains unchanged, i.e., 24.02.2016. The area areawise implementation details will be provided in the semi-annual monitoring reports (SMR).
- 8. The subproject would continue to have only temporary resettlement impacts due to laying of water supply and sewerage pipe networks. Pipes are being laid within road rights-of-way (RoW) and do not require land acquisition or cause permanent displacement. As indicated in RP and as per due diligence, this is to confirm that laying of the pipeline may cause temporary loss of access/disruption to livelihood during civil works to 645 vendors/traders located at both sides of the road. These are majorly non-titled movable /transitory structures (pushcarts, etc.) owners. As per information from design engineers and as observed, the maximum number of days the vendors experience loss of access/disruption of livelihood is 14 days, which is further minimized by scheduling civil works at night time or non-market day and lying of pipeline in phases. Temporarily APs are assisted in shifting to the other side of the road and also during the returning of their structures after construction. Where shifting is not required, access is ensured by the contractor through measures prescribed in bidding documents. In case the contractor fails to ensure access, PIU will ensure the release of compensation to these APs.
- 9. **Categorization.** Previously, this subproject was categorized as "B"⁴ for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. As per the due diligence conducted for this subproject, after SIP, no additional APs are identified, and the subproject category continues to remain "B." This updated RP has been prepared as per the SIP and complies with the agreed RF. No adverse impacts are anticipated on Indigenous People (IP) under the subproject, and no Indigenous Peoples Plan is required to be prepared.
- 10. **Public Consultations and Disclosure:** The consultations are being conducted regularly, and were also carried out during updating of RP. The consultations at the newly identified locations of CRMC, CCC, and SwPS, were undertaken by the PMDSC team to discuss the resettlement impacts. It was confirmed that all the selected lands were vacant govt land, and the construction of these subproject components would not cause any resettlement impacts. The social safeguard team is conducting preliminary consultations, through focus group discussions (FGD) and meetings with the APs as well as the general public. FGDs are conducted with the APs wherein policy-related issues, i.e., displacements and other issues like compensation and assistance, input to alternative design, are discussed. During consultation meetings, participants were of the view that this subproject is important and very much needed. All participants are pleased and committed to supporting the implementation of the project.
- 11. Revised/Updated RP will be made available in the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) and Project Management Unit (PMU) offices. The sub-project RP will be disclosed in ADB's

and the PMU websites. Leaflet prepared in the local language (Hindi) has been distributed to the APs in January (2016) for understanding the sub-projects scope, R&R provision, and grievance redressal mechanism (GRM) under this project. Cut-off-date for temporary impacts has been communicated to APs through survey agency and disclosed in the project affected area. There will be no change in the cut-off date(24.02.2016) as the survey data remains unchanged.

- 12. **Policy Framework and Entitlements.** The policy framework and entitlements for the program are based on national laws: the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation, and Resettlement Act, (RFCTLARR), 2013^{5,} (ii) ADB Safeguard Policy Statement(SPS), 2009; and agreed RF.
- 13. **Compensation and Income Restoration:** PIU is responsible for providing compensation in accordance with the entitlement matrix of the RF. As a policy, all affected persons are provided thirty days advance notice to ensure minimal disruption of livelihood. Compensation is being made prior to the start of civil works. If required, they are assisted in shifting for continued economic activity temporarily. For example, they are assisted in shifting to the other side of the road where there is no construction activities are being carried out.
- Grievance Redress Mechanism. GRM has been established under this sub-project. 14. As per mechanism, grievances of APs/ will first be brought to the attention of the Contractor, Social Development cum Gender Expert of Community Activities and Participation Consultant (CAPC), Implementing officer, PMDSC (Safeguard Staff of PMDSC) and PIU. They can immediately resolve issues on-site in consultation with each other and will be required to do so within three days of receipt of a complaint/grievance. All grievances that cannot be redressed within three days at the field/ ward level will be brought to the notice of the Social Project Officer (SPO) of PMU. PMU SPO will resolve the grievance within seven days of receipt of compliance/grievance in discussion with the PIU, CAPC/ Safeguard Staff, and the Contractor. All the grievances that are not addressed by PMU within seven days of receipt will be brought to the notice of the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC). The City Level Committee (CLC), established in every project town, acting as GRC. The GRC will resolve the grievance within fifteen days of receiving the complaint. An aggrieved person shall have access to the country's legal system at any stage, and accessing the country's legal system can run parallel to accessing the GRM and is not dependent on the negative outcome of the GRM. The PIU will keep records of all grievances received, including contact details of the complainant, date of the complaint received, nature of the grievance, agreed corrective actions and the date these were affected, and final outcome. All costs involved in resolving the complaints will be borne by the PMU. The GRCs will continue to function throughout the project duration.
- 15. **Institutional Arrangements:** The Local Self Government Department (LSGD), GoR) is the Executing Agency (EA) of the project and responsible for overall strategic approvals, guidance, monitoring the execution of the project. The current PMU of RUIDP, under the LSGD, is the Implementing Agency (IA) for the project. Six PIUs, one each of each six project towns, have been set up for implementation. PMU is providing support to PIUs in the implementation, management, and monitoring of the project. PMU and PIUs are be assisting by PMDSC. The PMU is assisted by a PMDSC's Social Safeguard Specialist (SSS). In addition to this, at the town level, Safeguard Implementation Officer (SIO) is appointed (as per recent variation in PMDSC Contract on the recommendation of ADB) to support the Contractor's outreach team in RP implementation.
- 16. **RP Implementation and Monitoring:** All compensations are paid prior to the start of civil works. RP implementation is closely monitored by PIU with assistance from PMDSC. The

monitoring process covers payment of compensation to affected persons, grievance procedures, information dissemination to affected persons on benefits, and options and implementation time table, livelihood, and living standard of affected persons in pre and post-project situations. Reports prepared by PIU are compiled by PMDSC's SSS and the PMU on a semi-annual basis for its due submissions to ADB. Till Dec 2019, a payment of Rs 746929 has been disbursed to 104 impacted APs out of 645 potential APs.

17. **Resettlement Budget:** The total resettlement cost for the subproject is **INR 4510495.** PIU is issuing sanction order for payment of APs and is making electronic clearance service/National Electronic Fund Transfer (ECS/NEFT) transaction from the bank through concerned Treasury (State Share). It is being ensured during disbursement that every AP is compensated as per the minimum wage rate applicable at the time of the disbursement date. Further, inflation of 7% (Flat) is given to AP (after a delay of one year) to cover the time lag of survey and final implementation

RESETTLEMENT PLAN

A. Sub-project Description

- 1. Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP), building on the previous two Asian Development Bank (ADB) funded projects: RUIDP and RUSDIP (also referred as RUIDP I and II respectively), will support the Government of India (GOI) and the Government of Rajasthan (GoR) in their policy of balanced regional socio-economic development and poverty reduction through improvements in urban governance, management, and infrastructure and service provision in six selected cities⁶ in Rajasthan. The selected cities are particularly district headquarters with more than 100,000 population and the ones which were not benefitted under the previous two ADB funded urban sector projects. With the main focus on the improvement of water supply and sewerage services, proposed RUSDP will be implemented over a six-year period beginning in 2014 through ADB's Sector Development Project (SDP). Pali Town water supply and sewerage scheme is one of the subprojects proposed under the investment component of RUSDP.
- 2. This sub-project for Pali is on Design Build & Operate(DBO) model and is under implementation after approval of the resettlement plan (RP) by ADB. During the finalization of the Service Improvement Plan (SIP), on the basis of the public consultation and technical requirement, locations of two Sewer Pumping Station (SwPS), four Consumer Relation Management Centre (CRMC), and a Central Control Centre (CCC) buildings have been finalized. In addition to that, the cleaning and renovation of Lakhotia Talab/Pond have also been finalized and taken up. The length of water supply and sewer networks has also been finalized after the detailed measurement survey by the DBO Contractor. The RP has been updated to include these changes. It is further confirmed that all other components remain unchanged. All the revised locations have been carefully selected by the PIU/PMDSC team, and civil works are confined within the government land.

During the SIP, the Contractor conducted a detailed measurement survey(DMS), and a length of 697.9 km has been finalized for a water supply network component and 329 km for the sewer network component. The capacity of STP was also finalized 15 mld instead of 12 mld.). Some areas within the municipal limits ⁷ which were left in preliminary design, and BoQ has been included in the subproject scope to provide the basic utilities to maximum households. The new areas added in the sewerage work (57 km) are mostly residential areas, while under the water supply component, the two new residential areas (Sindhiyon ki Dhani and Chimanpur village) have been included. Besides, in some areas, the water supply pipeline will now be laid on both sides; instead of only one side as intended earlier, this will help in extending the benefits to the maximum household. The comparative of the previous and final length is provided in Table 2.

The final scope of works of sub-projects includes: **Water Supply** (i) Distribution network improvement 697.9 km (HDPE-678.48 km and DI Pipe K7(19.42 km); (ii) CRMC-4 nos at Gandhi Nagar, Labour colony, Naya Goan and Mandali Head Works and a CCC at PHED main campus; (iii) Provision of house service connection -57115; (iv) Provision of domestic water meter; and (v) Cleaning and renovation works of Lakhotia Talab. **Sewerage** (i) Sewerage Treatment plant-15 mld in the existing STP campus; (ii) construction of two sewerage pumping station (SwPS) one behind housing board colony, and another one is near Sarvodaya Nagar with a capacity of 1 mld each; (iii) laying new sewers-329 km; (iv) Construction of manholes-16729; (v) Precast RCC inspection chamber-44691; (vi) provision of sewer connections to houses. The project scope also includes O&M of the created assets for 10 years.
- 5. This RP is revised based on the final design and alignment after completion of detailed measurement surveys. This RP document is prepared for proposed water supply and sewerage sub-projects in Pali in line with the Resettlement Framework (RF) prepared for the implementation of social safeguards under RUSDP.
- 6. **Categorization**: This subproject has been categorized as "B"⁸ for involuntary resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. As per the due diligence conducted for this subproject, no additional APs are identified after SIP;

Similarly the sewer network included the new areas (Amarnath Nagar, Babunagar Extension, Behind Ambedkar Nagar and Rajiv colony) which were left during the prelimanry design.

thus, the subproject category continues to remain "B". No adverse impacts are anticipated on Indigenous People (IP) under the subproject and is categorized as "C" as per the SPS, 2009. No Indigenous Peoples Plan is required to be prepared.





Figure 1: Proposed Distribution Networks

Figure 2: Site Plan of Sewerage Project







Figure 3: Proposed Layout plan of STP





B. Scope of Land Acquisition and Resettlement

7. The subproject does not require any acquisition of land. Construction of a new sewage treatment plant (STP) will be undertaken within the existing STP campus, which is under the possession of Pali Nagar Parishad (Municipal body), and SwPS at Sarvodaya Nagar is also under Nagar Parishad possession. SwPS behind the housing board colony is proposed in vacant government land, which is under the possession of the Public Health Engineering Department (PHED). The construction of four CRMC and a CCC will be undertaken within the existing PHED Campus. No new land acquisition is required. No IR impact will be anticipated during the cleaning and restoration work of Lakhotia Talab/pond. All the works like cleaning, strengthening of sidewalls, pitching will be done within the existing campus of the pond, which is under the possession of Nagar Parishad. The land details of the project components are presented in Table 3, and NoC / correspondence letter is attached in Annexure 1, and a google map of proposed sites is appended in Appendix 2 to 9.

- 8. Due diligence has been conducted, and it was confirmed that all the additional works (SwPS, CRMC, CCC) are proposed in the premises of PHED. Municipal council offices premises and renovation and cleaning works will be executed on the premises of Lakhotiya Pond, and will not cause any land acquisition and resettlement impacts.
- 9. During SIP, the length of the water supply and sewerage network has been increased (**Ref Table.2**). The new areas included in the subproject scope under the sewerage and water supply components are mostly in the residential areas and does not cause any resettlement impacts. The streets where the laying of water supply pipeline will be now undertaken on both sides of the road, the affected persons (AP) have already been accounted for. At the time of preparation of RP, people carrying on business activities on both sides of the road in the entire town were considered as the potential APs, as such, the additional components will not change in the number of people likely to be impacted. It was further reconfirmed during the

due diligence, and as such cut-off date remains unchanged, i.e., 24.02.2016. The area areawise implementation details will be provided in the semi-annual monitoring reports (SMR).

- 10. The resettlement impacts under the subproject are due to the laying of water supply and sewerage pipe networks. Pipes are being laid within road rights-of-way (RoW) and do not require any land acquisition or cause permanent displacement but cause temporary access disruptions and temporary losses in income during construction. It was estimated through social impact assessment (SIA) followed by 100% socio-economic survey that laying of the pipeline may cause temporary loss of access/disruption to livelihood to 645 vendors/traders located at both sides of the road (Ref **Annexure 10**). These are majorly non-titled movable /transitory structures (pushcarts, etc.) owners operating/ occupying the ROW. (**Details are in Table 4**).
- 11. As per information from design engineers, a maximum number of days the traders/vendors experience loss of access/disruption of livelihood is fourteen days, which is further minimized by scheduling civil works at night time or non-market day and laying of pipeline in phases. Temporarily affected persons (APs) are assisted in moving to the other side of the roads (if required) and also assisted in returning their structures after construction gets completed. Where moving is not required, access is ensured by the contractor through measures prescribed in bidding documents. To ensure that there is no income or access is the responsibility of the contractor. In case the contractor fails to ensure access, PIU will ensure the release of compensation to these APs.


12. Trenchless work/ night works/ working in non-business hours are planned in high-density areas/ streets with all safety provisions. Extensive consultations are made with the residents and shop owners, and they are being informed about the upcoming works. The actual dates of construction schedule with respect to rush hour, festival time, and special business days have been discussed with vendors, squatters, market committee members, and residents, and intimated to the contractor for planning construction activities accordingly. Consent for the works and for bearing temporary inconvenience is being taken (See Annexure 11. The consultation will continue with the residents and shop owners throughout project implementation. After laying of pipes, the lane/road is being restored to its original condition (including bitumen, cement concrete (CC), and CC interlocking tiles as applicable). Summary of sub-project components and possible IR impact are shown in Table 6.






Figure 5(v): Drawing showing the Project Impacted Area



13. **Impact on Common Property Resources (CPR):** Extent of impacts on CPRs has also been assessed. As of now, there is no impact envisaged on any CPR. However, there are some sensitive receptors in close proximity to the sub-project alignment (**Ref Annexure 12 for details**). The contractor has been instructed to take due care during implementation.


C. Socio-economic Information and Profile

- 14. The following sections present the socio-economic profile of the households likely to be affected by the proposed works. To estimate the temporary impacts initially, a series of transect walks were conducted; this was followed by a 100 percent census and a socio-economic survey conducted in the areas where the works are to be taken up (Sample format is attached in **Annexure 13**). The baseline information collected through the survey provides the socio-economic conditions of affected households. A wide range of data including social category, Type of losses, Type of Occupation, sources of income, choice of resettlement etc. have been collected by conducting a census and socio-economic survey among likely project affected households.
- 15. The database provides a broad understanding of the social and economic conditions of project-affected households and the likely impacts that people would experience due to proposed Works. A selected set of socio-economic information is discussed in the following sections to establish the profile of the project affected persons. The database generated through household socio-economic survey would be used by the monitoring and evaluation consultant for evaluation of the resettlement plan objectives.
- 16. Respondents were asked to provide monthly income against the business. For the purpose of analysis, the income groups to which the households belong to are discussed below. The households have been grouped into the following categories. They are households having an income of less than and equal to Rs. 2500/- per month, Rs. 2501 to 6000 per month, Rs. 6000 to 10000/- per month and more than Rs. 10000/- per month. Data collected have been complied as above are presented below.
- 17. Income: One household with a monthly income of less than or equal to Rs. 2500/- per month was identified. 10 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.100/per day. 10 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.150 per day, 35 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.225 per day. 10% of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs. 250 per day. 25 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.300 per day. 1 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.350 per day. 5% of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.400 per day. 3 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.500 per day. 0.5 % of the households likely




to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.600 per day. 0.5 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.700-1000 per day. The average earning of these people is approximately 242/- per day, and the average household income works out to be 7260/- per month. But taking into consideration the Minimum Wages in Rajasthan (as on date), the average per day income per AP comes to Rs. 257 /-. The Resettlement Budget has been prepared on the basis of minimum wages in vogue.

18. **Caste:** Households likely to be affected as per social category have been presented in **Annexure 2**. General Caste Comprise 19%, Other Backward Castes (OBC) comprises 60%, Scheduled Caste comprises 20%, and Schedule Tribe comprises 1%.




19. **Vulnerability:** Out of 645 APs, 190 APs comes under vulnerable group category likely to be affected. WHH¹⁰ comprises of 41%, SC comprises of 57%, BPL comprises of 1%, ST comprises 0.5.%, and Physical Disabled comprises of 0.5%.






20. Around 30% have movable structures, while 66% have cabin/ kiosk have, and 4% sit on roads for selling their goods.




21. An average cost of their business unit/structure was estimated at Rs. 9869 with a minimum at Rs. 400 and maximum at Rs. 500000.








24. **Working in Towns in Years**: 49% APs are living/working in town since last 1 to 10 years, 29% APs are living/working in town since last 11 to 20 years, 11% APs are living in town/working since last 21 to 30 years, while 5% APs are living/working in town since last 31 to 40 years. 6% are living/working in town for less than one year.



25. Working hours (Hrs/day) at Single Place: 54% APs have indicated that they work at a fixed location for 6 to 10 hrs/day, 41% APs have indicated that they have worked at a fixed location for 11 to 15 Hrs/day, 3% APs have indicated that they work at a fixed location for 16-18 hrs/day, while 2% APs have indicated working at a fixed location for 3 to 5 hrs/day.



26. **Type of Family:** Out of 645 APs, 78% have a nuclear family, 22% have a joint family. Only one household has an extended family



D. Information Disclosure, Consultation, and Participation

27. The updated RP was prepared in consultation with stakeholders. The key stakeholders consulted during various stages of RP preparation include (i) all APs, including vulnerable households; (ii) program beneficiaries (iii) elected representatives, community leaders, and representatives of community- based organizations; (iv) local NGOs; (v) local government and relevant government agency representatives; and (vi) Program staff, PMU, PIU, and consultants. Meetings and individual interviews were held involving stakeholders, particularly, potentially temporarily APs; and transect walks, surveys, and interviews were conducted from August 2015 to March 2016 to determine the potential impacts of the subproject. The issues like awareness and extent of the project and development components, benefits of the project, traffic disruptions, and impacts on livelihood. It was informed to APs surveyed that appropriate measures will be undertaken during construction

to minimize impacts. The consultations at the newly identified locations, CRMC, CCC, and SwPS, were undertaken by the PMDSC team to discuss the resettlement impacts. It was confirmed that all the selected sites were vacant government land, and the construction of subproject components would not cause any resettlement impacts. During the consultations, the stakeholders were informed that, despite mitigation measures, if there are any temporary impacts, they would be compensated in accordance with the resettlement plan's entitlement matrix. (**Ref Annexure 14 for details of the consultation)**

- 28. The revised RP documents will be disclosed on ADB and RUSDIP websites and will be available in PIU and PMU. During the subproject implementation, construction schedules are informed to all residents (including APs) prior to the commencement of pipe laying through signboards. The signboards are in local language and include (at minimum): (i) section to be affected, (ii) start and end dates, (iii) information on traffic rerouting if any, and (iv) Contact information for questions/ grievances.
- 29. Information dissemination and disclosure is a continuous process since the beginning of the program. Information dissemination is carried out through printed leaflets/ information booklets that are prepared by the PMDSC in the local language. The summary of RP has been provided to the APs and stakeholders through leaflet (Hindi script) between 28th Jan to 10th Feb 2016. The same was circulated to the PMU & PIU office. Leaflets are distributed not only to APs but also to people (residents, businessmen, and others) within the immediate project influence area in advance so that people could be made aware about the project work and its benefit and also R&R provision under these project. (See Annexure 15 & 16
- 30. The leaflet/ information booklet contained the following:
- Description of the project and its objectives:
- > Summary of impacts (including land acquisition, and impacts on common property resources, etc.);
- Resettlement &Rehabilitation provisions of the project and specific benefits available to vulnerable APs;
- Wavs and means of involving local communities:
- Grievance redress mechanisms, suggestion, and complaint handling mechanism, etc.

31. For the temporary impacts, the date/period of socio-economic surveys was considered a cut-off date. Cut-off-date for temporary impacts was communicated to APs through NGO and PMDSC on dated **24.02.2016** (See Annexure 17 & 18) and also by putting up printed information in the project-affected area at common advertisement place. Similarly, the list of APs was published at common places with contact details of PIU officials. The list was put up area wise and at a time for the entire city. The objective of the cut-off-date was to avoid APs moving into other areas and to identify any duplication of APs. The cut-off date remains unchanged after SIP, as the survey data remains unchanged.

E. Grievance Redress Mechanism

32. The grievance redress mechanism (GRM) has been well established under this subproject. The RP follows the three-tier project-specific GRM furnished in the RF. The GRM established under this project and will receive, evaluate, and facilitate the resolution of AP's concerns, complaints, and grievances about the social and environmental performance at the level of the project. The GRM aims to provide a time-bound and transparent mechanism to voice and resolve social and environmental concerns linked to the project.

- 33. In case of grievances that are immediate and urgent in the perception of the complainant, the contractor, and supervision personnel from PIU, the PMDSC on-site provides the most easily accessible or first level of contact for quick resolution of grievances. Contact phone numbers and names of the concerned PIU Assistant Safeguards Officer/Nodal Officer, contractors, will be posted at all construction sites at visible locations.
 - (i) **1st level grievance**. The contractors, PIU supervision personnel, PIU Assistant Safeguards Officer/Nodal Officer, and Safeguard implementing Staff/CAPC, can immediately resolve issues on-site in consultation with each other. They will be required to do so within three days of receipt of a complaint/grievance.
 - (ii) 2nd level grievance. All grievances that cannot be redressed within three days at the field/ward level will be brought to the notice of the Social Project Officer (SPO) of PMU. PMU SPO will resolve the grievance within seven days of receipt of compliance/grievance in discussion with the PIU, CAPC/Safeguard Implementation Staff, and the Contractor.
 - (iii) 3rd level grievance. All the grievances that are not addressed by PMU within seven days of receipt will be brought to the notice of the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC). The City Level Committee (CLC), established in every project city, will act as GRC¹¹. GRC will meet twice a month and determine the merit of each grievance brought to the committee. The PIU ASO will be responsible for seeing through the process of redressal of each grievance. The GRC will resolve the grievance within fifteen days of receiving the complaint.
- 34. The project GRM notwithstanding, an aggrieved person shall have access to the country's legal system at any stage, and accessing the country's legal system can run parallel to accessing the GRM and is not dependent on the negative outcome of the GRM. Alternatively, if the grievance is related to land acquisition, resettlement & rehabilitation 12, the APs can approach the Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Authority (LARRA).
- 35. In the event that the established GRM is not in a position to resolve the issue, the APs also can use the ADB's Accountability Mechanism through directly contacting (in writing) the Complaint Receiving Officer (CRO) at ADB headquarters or the ADB India Resident Mission (INRM). The complaint can be submitted in any of the official languages of ADB's DMCs. The ADB's Accountability Mechanism information will be included in the project information documents (PID) to be distributed to the affected communities, as part of the project GRM.
- 36. Records will be kept of all grievances received, including contact details of the complainant, date of the complaint received, nature of the grievance, agreed corrective actions and the date of these were effected, and final outcome. All costs involved in resolving the complaints (meetings, consultations, communication, and reporting/information




Figure 6: Grievance Redress Process

F. Legal Framework

- 37. The policy framework and entitlements for the RUSDP are based on:
 - (i) The recently passed-The The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation, and Resettlement Act (RFCT in LARR),
 - (ii) ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. The salient features of Government and ADB policies are summarized below. The resettlement principles and procedures to be followed for social safeguards under RUSDP are detailed out in the RF document.
- 38. Core involuntary resettlement principles for the RUSDP to be followed for each subproject, including sample sub-projects are:
 - (i) Land acquisition and other involuntary resettlement impacts will be avoided or minimized exploring all viable alternative sub-project designs;
 - (ii) Where unavoidable, time-bound resettlement plans (RPs) will be prepared and APs will be assisted in improving or at least regaining their pre-program standard of living;

- (iii) Full information and close consultations with APs including consultation with APs on compensation, disclosure of resettlement information to APs, and participation of APs in planning and implementing sub-projects will be ensured;
- (iv) Vulnerable groups will be provided special assistance¹³
- (v) Payment of compensation to APs including non-titled persons (e.g., informal dwellers/squatters, and encroachers) for acquired assets at replacement rates;
- (vi) Payment of compensation and resettlement assistance prior to the contractor taking physical acquisition of the land and prior to the commencement of any construction activities:
- (vii) Provision of income restoration and rehabilitation; and
- (viii) Establishment of appropriate grievance redress mechanisms.
- 39. APs will be entitled to a combination of compensation measures and resettlement assistance, depending on the nature of ownership rights of lost assets and scope of the impact, including the social and economic vulnerability of the APs.

G. Entitlements, Assistance, and Benefits

- 40. All APs who are identified in the subproject areas on the cut-off date will be entitled to compensation for their affected assets, and rehabilitation measures (as outlined in the entitlement matrix below) sufficient to assist them to improve or at least maintain their preproject living standards, income-earning capacity, and production levels. Compensation eligibility is limited by a cut-off date as set for this project on the day of the completion of the census survey, which is **24.02.2016** in this case. APs who settle in the affected areas after the cut-off date will not be eligible for compensation and assistance. APs will be provided 30 days advance notice to ensure no or minimal disruption in livelihood. If required, they will also be assisted to temporarily shift for continued economic activity. For example, they will be assisted in shifting to the other side of the road where there is no construction. Ensuring there is no income or access loss during sub-project construction is the responsibility of contractors.
- 41. In the majority of the cases, work will be undertaken on one side of the road at a time, and temporarily affected persons (APs) will be assisted in moving to the other side of the road and returning their structures after construction is completed. Where moving is not required, access will be ensured by the contractor through measures prescribed in bidding documents/environmental management plan (EMP). The PIU and the Safeguard Implementation staff provides the identity cards (ID) to each of the APs. The entitlement matrix for the subproject based on the above policies is in Table 10.
- 42. The construction period is minimized and ranges from 7 days to 14 days per section of work. Though the construction period is different for water supply and sewerage works, livelihood losses are estimated/ provided for 14 days considering road restoration (which forces movable vendors to operate from a different place) works. It is suggested that water supply and sewerage works should be carried out at parallel to minimize impacts on stretches where both the works are proposed.
- 43. If construction activities result in unavoidable livelihood disruption, compensation for lost income, or a transitional allowance for the period of disruption, whichever is greater will be provided. Vulnerable APs will be given priority in project construction employment and provided with additional special assistance for income restoration support. Compensation and assistance to APs must be made prior to possession of land/assets and prior to the award of

civil works contracts. Since most affected households have moveable stalls, ID cards should be distributed 30 days before compensation. In summary, temporarily APs will be provided with:

- (i) 30 days advance notice regarding construction activities, including duration and type of disruption.
- (ii) Contractor's actions to ensure there is no income/access loss consistent with the initial environmental examination. This includes: leaving spaces for access between mounds of soil, providing walkways and metal sheets to maintain access across trenches for people and vehicles where required, increased workforces to finish work in areas with impacts on access, the timing of works to reduce disruption during business hours, phased construction schedule and working one segment at a time and one side of the road at a time.
- (iii) Assistance to mobile vendors/hawkers to temporarily shift for continued economic activity. For example, assistance to shift to the other side of the road where there is no construction.
- (iv) For construction activities involving unavoidable livelihood disruption, compensation for lost income, or a transitional allowance for the period of disruption, whichever is greater.

H. Resettlement Budget and Financing Plan

44. The resettlement cost estimate for the Pali water and sewerage subproject includes resettlement assistance, as outlined in the entitlement matrix and contingency provision amounting to be 5% of the total cost. The funds for resettlement are released in a timely manner. The total resettlement cost for the subproject is **INR 4510495**. The resettlement cost items and estimates are outlined in **Table 9**. PIU is issuing sanction order for payment of APs and making electronic clearance service/National Electronic Fund Transfer (ECS/NEFT) transaction from the bank through concerned Treasury from state share. The Safeguard Implementation Staff mobilized at the town/PIU level, will facilitate the entire disbursement process and assist APs in the opening bank accounts (incase APs does not have an account)

I. Institutional Arrangements and Implementation Schedule

- 45. The Local Self Government Department (LSGD) is the executing agency (EA) for overall technical supervision and execution of all subprojects funded under the program. The Implementing Agency is the PMU of the ongoing RUIDP and is responsible for coordinating the construction of subprojects and ensuring consistency across the towns. PIU has been established in Pali. The inter-ministerial Empowered Committee provides LSGD with central policy guidance and coordination, and CLCs have been established in Pali to oversee the implementation at the city level. The PMU is assisted by PMDSC, who manages the program and assure the technical quality of the design and construction; managing the tendering of contractors, and supervising construction.
- 46. SPO at PMU is responsible for (i) addressing the social safeguards issues; (ii) implementing the RP; (iii) liaising with district administration for land acquisition and RP implementation; (iv) addressing any problems and/or delays in the land acquisition process including GRM management and monitor the overall complaint resolution status; (v) monitoring physical and financial progress on land acquisition activities; (vi) monitoring the implementation of RPs; (vii) providing guidance to PIUs as and when necessary; and (viii) endorsing and submitting periodic semi-annual social safeguard monitoring reports.
- 47. The PMU will be assisted by a SSS of PMDSC. The SSS will (i) update the existing RPs based on the detailed design; (ii) assist in the monitoring and supervision of ongoing subprojects and RP implementation; (iii) prepare RP and/or IPPs for new subprojects, where required to comply with national law and/or ADB procedure; (iv) ensure all subprojects meet safeguard requirements as agreed in the loan covenant and in line with the RF; and (v) review and finalize all reports in consultation with the SPO, PMU (RP updating and preparation, preparation of semi-annual social safeguard monitoring report for PMU submission to ADB, and support GRM implementation). In addition, SSS will assist the PMU in procurement needs and other project implementation aspects and shall play a central role in ensuring capacity building on resettlement management of the PMU and line departments through

capacity development support and training. The implementation of role and responsibility are presented in Table 10. The implementation arrangement of environment and resettlement safeguards is provided in Figure 8.

- At each PIU, a Nodal officer of the rank of Assistant Engineer (AE) is designated as Assistant Safeguards officer (ASO). ASO assists SPO, PMU in the implementation of the social safeguards at the PIU level. The PIUs are responsible for the implementation of the RP. PIUs are responsible for undertaking the internal monitoring and supervision and record observations throughout the project period to ensure that the safeguards and mitigation measures are provided as intended. ASO is responsible for following activities (i) implementing and monitoring the safeguards compliance activities, public relations activities, gender mainstreaming activities, and community participation activities; (ii) coordinating with district administration and NGO for land acquisition and R&R aspects and addressing any problems and/or delays; (iii) monitoring the physical and financial progress on land acquisition and R&R activities including record keeping of the grievance and redress issues as reported by CAPC/Safeguard Implementation Staff/Contractor and prepare and submit a monthly report on safeguards to be consolidated by PIU Assistant Safeguards officer (ASO); and (iv) organizing monthly meetings with the contractor, outreach team and safeguard implementation staff of PMDSC to review the progress on R&R. A tentative implementation schedule is given in Table 11.
- In addition to safeguards staff at PMU, PIU, and PMDSC, the EA has appointed a Safeguard Staff in PMDSC and Social Development Expert cum Gender Expert(SDGE) in CAPC to support the implementation of RP in Pali. Key activities of the implementing Safeguard Staff of PMDSC in relation to resettlement planning and implementation will include: (i) conducting detailed survey of physically and economically displaced persons based on detailed design, and identifying poor, female-headed, and vulnerable households affected by land acquisition and resettlement; (ii) preparing the list of the potentially affected persons and issue identification cards; (iii) facilitating the process of disbursement of compensation to the affected persons, coordinating with the revenue department and informing the affected persons of the compensation disbursement process and timeline; (iv) assisting affected persons in opening bank accounts, explaining the implications, rules, and obligations of a joint account and how he or she can access the resources he or she is entitled to; (v) assist the EA in ensuring a smooth transition (during the partial or full relocation of the affected persons), helping them to take salvaged materials and shift whenever required³². In close consultation with the affected persons, the implementing Safeguard Staff shall inform the PMU about the shifting dates agreed upon in writing and the arrangements they desire with respect to their entitlements; (vi) organizing training programs for income restoration; (vii) conducting meaningful, ongoing consultation and ensuring disclosure of RPs in an accessible manner to the affected persons; (viii) assisting PIUs in GRM; (ix) assisting PIUs in keeping detailed records of progress and establishing monitoring and reporting systems of resettlement; (x) acting as the information source for community interaction with the project, and liaising between community, PMDSC contractors, and project management and implementing units during the execution of the works; and (xi) providing advice and other support to PIUs as required.



J. Monitoring and Reporting

- 50. Monitoring and evaluation are important activities of any infrastructure development project involving involuntary resettlement. It helps in making suitable changes, if required during the course of implementation of resettlement related activities, and also help to resolve problems faced by the APs. Monitoring is periodical checking of planned activities and provides midway inputs, facilitates changes, if necessary, and provides feedback to Project Authority for better management of project activities.
- 51. RP implementation will be closely monitored to provide the PMU with an effective basis for assessing resettlement progress and identifying potential difficulties and problems. As per ADB guidelines, for category B projects, only internal monitoring will be required. Internal monitoring for Pali will be undertaken by the PIU (through the PMDSC's SSS) with assistance from the PMU SPO. Monthly progress reports will be prepared and submitted to the PMU. PMU will consolidate the same and will submit semi-annual monitoring reports to the ADB for approval.

K. Due Diligence Findings after Service Improvement Plan (SIP)

- 52. During the preparatory stage (before initiation of civil works) of the project, the land acquisition and involuntary resettlement issues were examined in line with ADB SPS 2009. Thereafter, during the implementation, detailed design and detailed measurement surveys (DMS) were to be jointly conducted by DBO Contractor, safeguard personnel of PIU and field engineer of PMDSC, in which involuntary resettlement impacts were reconfirmed. This report describes the findings of the due diligence for involuntary resettlement plan revision and provides copies of relevant documents, maps, and photographs.
- 53. During the finalization of the Service Improvement Plan (SIP), the location of two Sewer Pumping Station (SwPS) and four Consumer Relation Management Centres (CRMC)-and Central Control Centre (CCC) building has been finalized. In addition to that, the cleaning and renovation of Lakhotia Talab/Pond works have also been proposed.
- 54. Details of locations changed under the sub-project are tabulated as below:-

- 55. A due diligence visit to the permanent sites(where civil works started) along with the review of the available document was undertaken to –
- To reconfirm whether the sub-project causes any resettlement impacts (temporary/permanent, partial/full) impacts on structures and livelihoods non-titled affected persons (AP).
- To collect evidence (documents, photographs, and videography) to understand/ identify resettlement impacts (if any)
- To organize public consultation along the project sites to discuss the resettlement impacts
- 56. Due diligence/ field visits (conducted by a team including staff of PMDSC, PIU, Project contractor, and safeguard staff from PIU/PMDSC) revealed that the vacant land was available in PHED campus at Gandhi Nagar, Naya Goan and Labour colony where CRMC works have been undertaken. Similarly, vacant land was available by PHED in the housing board colony for the proposed SwPS-1. The consultation was also done with nearby habitations, and it was confirmed that all the selected lands were totally vacant.

57. As on date, the work on CCC building at PHED Main campus, CRMC building at Mandli Campus and SwPS at Sarvodaya Nagar has not started. Impact assessment is done, and it was noticed that vacant land is available for the aforesaid works. CCC and CRMCs are proposed in the existing PHED campus, while SwPS at Sarvodaya Nagar is proposed in municipal land. No IR impact will be anticipated during restoration work of Lakhotia Talab as all the works like cleaning, strengthening of sidewalls, pitching will be done within the existing campus, which is under the possession of Pali Municipal Cooperation. Pre-construction photographs of all the changed components are enclosed for ready reference:-




58. Some areas within the municipal limits ³³ which were left in preliminary design, and BoQ has been included in the subproject scope to provide the basic utilities to maximum households. The new areas added in the sewerage work (57 km) are mostly residential areas, while under the water supply component, the two new residential areas(Sindhiyon ki Dhani and Chimanpur village) have been included. Besides, in some areas, the water supply pipeline will now be laid on both sides; instead of only one side as intended earlier, this will help in extending the benefits to the maximum household. The streets where the laying of water supply pipeline will be now undertaken on both sides of the road, the APs has already been accounted for since at the time of preparation of RP, people carrying on business activities on both sides of the road in the entire town were considered as the potential APs. Thus, the additional impacts will not change in the number of people likely to be impacted. It was further reconfirmed during the due diligence, and as such cut-off date remains unchanged, i.e., 24.02.2016.

Conclusion:

59. As per due diligence, no additional APs were identified due to additional works proposed under these packages. The category of the subproject remains "B" as there is no land acquisition under the project, and the subproject would continue to have only temporary resettlement impacts due to laying of water supply and sewerage pipe networks. No impact is envisaged on CPRs.


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
Proposed STP land in the existing STP campus





Annexure 19(a): Proceedings of City Level Stakeholder Consultation Meeting At Pali on April, 28, 2014

- 1. This stakeholder consultation meeting was organized on April 28, 2014 at Pali District collector's meeting hall. The meeting was organized by the Pali Nagar Parishad (PNP) with the support of RUIDP PMU and ADB PPTA Team. District Collector Pali chaired the meeting. The PNP Chairman (elected head of PNP), and Commission (administration head of PNP) participated in the meeting. In all 19 persons, representing various agencies, attended the meeting (List of persons attended the meeting is enclosed herewith).
- 2. The objective of the meeting was to appraise the stakeholders about the proposed Rajasthan urban Infrastructure Development Project III (RUIDP III). The subprojects proposed for Pali in water supply and sewerage sector, and the likely environmental and social issues, and the proposed mitigation measures were discussed during the meeting.
- **3.** A detailed presentation on overall RUIDP III, and subprojects and components proposed in Pali was made to the stakeholders. Executive summary of Initial Environmental Examination (IEE)/RP conducted for the Pali subproject, Environmental Management Plan, proposed Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM), draft Entitlement Matrix of the Resettlement Framework was displayed at the meeting, and were made available to the interested persons.
- **4.** The comments, suggestions of the stakeholders are presented below:
 - All the stakeholders were supportive of the project and indicated their willingness to participate in the project to make it successful.
 - Stakeholders were of the view that these subprojects provide benefits to all the people by improving water supply and sewerage.
 - Most of the stakeholder, including the Collector, opined that drainage and solid waste management should also be taken up in the project. However, RUIDP PMU officials informed the meeting that this project's focus is on water supply and sewerage.
 - Most of the stakeholders advocated use of treated waste water for industrial purposes, and should be included in the sewerage project proposals.
 - Stakeholder also suggested to include in the project, development of Lakhotia Lake, located in the centre of the city. It was informed the RUIDP III focus will be on water supply and sewerage.
 - Stakeholders were concerned about the road restoration works after laying water and sewer lines. The concern was that normally road restoration is not taken up after the work. It was informed that road restoration works are part of sewer/water supply projects, and will be taken up.


